

Statement of Interest Framework

1. Introduction

- Brief self-introduction and current position/affiliation.
- Concise statement of purpose for applying to the grant.

[Example: I am a PhD candidate in Environmental Science at Example University, seeking support for my research on urban sustainability.]

2. Relevance to Grant Objectives

- Describe how your background or project aligns with the grant's goals.
- Mention relevant fields, themes, or priorities of the grant call.

3. Project Overview

- Brief summary of the research or project you propose.
- Highlight main objectives, methods, and expected results.

[Example: I propose to use mixed methods to evaluate green infrastructure initiatives in three cities, aiming to identify scalable best practices.]

4. Anticipated Impact

- Explain the potential significance of your project.
- Potential scholarly, societal, or policy contributions.

[Example: This project will inform urban policy and contribute to academic literature on sustainable city planning.]

5. Qualifications

- Highlight relevant skills, experience, or previous work.
- Demonstrate your capability to deliver the proposed project.

[Example: My prior publications and collaboration with local governments equip me to ensure the project's success.]

6. Closing

- Express thanks for consideration.
- State willingness to provide further information.

[Example: Thank you for considering my application. I am happy to provide further details as needed.]
