## 1. Background / Context

*Provide a brief background or context for the research problem.*

*e.g., What is the broader topic or area? Why is it important?*

## 2. Statement of the Problem

*Clearly and concisely state the main research problem you intend to address.*

*e.g., What is not known, not understood, or not resolved?*

## 3. Evidence of the Problem

- Present data, literature, or examples that illustrate the existence and significance of the problem.
- Highlight gaps, challenges, or limitations in existing knowledge or practice.

## 4. Rationale / Justification

*Explain why it is important to address this problem.*

*e.g., Who will benefit? What will be improved or clarified?*

## 5. Research Questions / Objectives

*List the main research question(s) or objectives derived from the problem statement.*

## 6. Scope and Limitations

*Describe the scope of your research and acknowledge potential limitations.*

## 7. Definition of Key Terms (Optional)

*Define important or ambiguous terms used in the problem statement (if applicable).*
